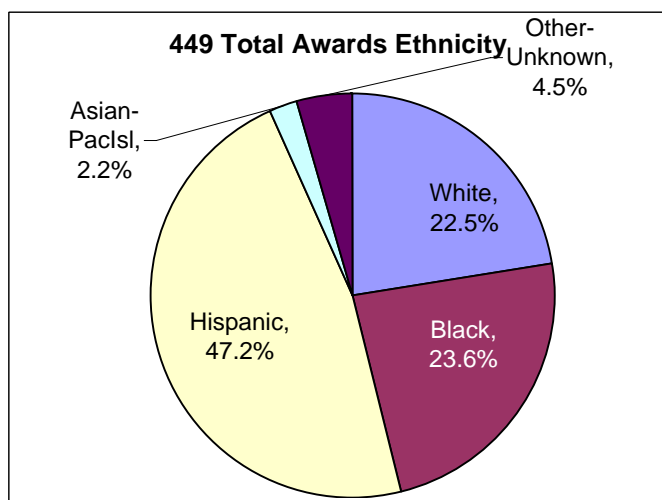
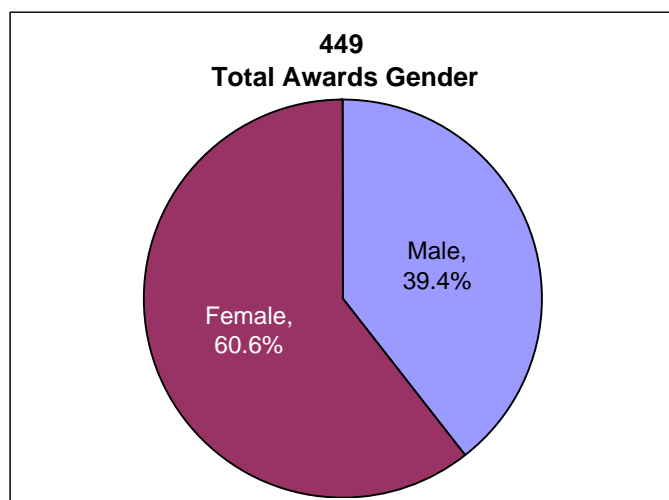

2007-2008 Award Highlights

The majority (61%) of all award recipients were women.
The greatest proportion of men in any award category was 50% of AAS degree recipients.

The ethnic breakdown of award recipients mirror the ethnicity of the general student body with Hispanics representing the largest number of in all award categories, Blacks are second, and White third.

The oldest average age of 31 belongs to the 48 AAS degree recipients.
The youngest average age of 25 belongs to the 153 AS degree recipients.

The cumulative GPA for all award recipients was 3.13 with all award categories 3.06 or greater.

The top two associate degrees granted include AS.SCIENCE (Liberal Sciences) with 122 graduates; and AA.ARTS (Liberal Arts) with 100 graduates.

The top three Career and Technical Programs (AAS and Certificates) include Criminal Justice with 42 awards; Business Administration with 31 awards; and Computer Aided Drafting with 28 awards.

NOTE: The 449 MVC 2007-2008 total awards are 23 more than the 426 total awards granted in 2006-2007. In the past year, AA, AS, AAS degrees and Certificates increased 6.6%, while AAT degrees decreased by three degrees.

The 449 total awards were conferred to 375 individual students: 325 earned one degree or certificate; 33 earned two degrees and/or certificates; and 17 earned three or more.
