Fall 2007 Credit Student Enrollment Change Analysis
October 10, 2007
Executive Summary

The Fall 2007 census headcount of 6,875 students at Mountain View College is 2.4% less than the Fall 2006 MVC record high enrollment of 7,044. Fall 2007 is the second highest credit enrollment in MVC history.

Unduplicated Student Headcount Highlights

Demographics: *(page 1 of "MVC Fall 2007 Enrollment Analysis Report")*

- Hispanic and Asian students increased in number and proportion while Black and White students decreased
- Students age 15 and below continue to increase because of the Early College High School

Classification: *(page 2)*

- Both Full-time and Part-time students decreased proportionately
- First Year (freshmen) students decreased 9% (-335) down to 3,429
- Second year (sophomore) increased 7% (147) up to 2,374
- First-Time-in-College students decreased 11% (-192) down to 1,489

Other Headcount Highlights: *(page 2)*

- Dual Credit students decreased 30% (-200) down to 470
- ECHS Dual Credit increased 108 students up to 208
- Rising Star students decreased for the third consecutive Fall semester down to 677

Student Declared Majors Highlights: *(page 3)*

- Undecided majors make up 39% (2,650) of all students
- Followed by Liberal Arts and Sciences majors 31% (2,135)
- Followed next by Accounting, Business, and Management majors 8% (533)

Recent High School Graduates Enrolled Highlights: *(page 3)*

- Total recent (May) high school graduates increased 15% from 553 to 638
- High schools with 50 or more May 2007 graduates attending MVC in Fall 2007 include: Duncanville, So Grand Prairie, Moises Molina, Sunset, and Grand Prairie

Financial Aid Highlights: (As of October 5, 2007) *(pages 6-7)*

- Total students receiving financial aid decreased 8% from 1,627 to 1,497
- These 1,497 students have received 2,525 types of aid totaling \$2. 63 m
- The largest increase is 206 (+81%) additional for a total of 461 Texas Grants and TEOG Grants

Unduplicated Student Headcount Highlights (continued)

ZIP Code Highlights: *(pages 8-9)*

- Total MVC Service Area residents decreased 4% (-208)
- Cedar Hill ZIP codes recorded the only increase +5%
- Duncanville ZIP codes decreased for the third consecutive Fall semester -16%
- Dallas ZIP Code 75211 (MVC's immediate neighborhood) increased for the third consecutive Fall semester +7%
- Southeast Dallas ZIP Codes (not in MVC's service area) increased for the third consecutive Fall semester +2%

Duplicated Student Course Enrollments Highlights

Overall number of class sections decreased 45 (-4%) and student course enrollments decreased 2.6% (445) which is proportionate to the student headcount decrease

Schedule Highlights: *(page 4)*

- Total MWF and MW days on campus enrollments increased 161 (3%) to 4,847
- Evening course enrollments decreased slightly
- TR days, Weekend, MTWR and MTWRF Days on-campus enrollments decreased
- Distance learning enrollments continue to increase, up 30% to 1,504
- Self-paced enrollments continue to decrease, down 25% to 697

Instructional Division Highlights: *(page 5)*

- Communications and Teacher Education Division course enrollments and contact hours increased for the third consecutive Fall semester up 143 course enrollments to 4,468 and 8,224 contact hours to 228,336
- Science, Allied Health, and Physical Education Division increased 48 (3%) course enrollments to 1,748
- Student Support Services HDEV course enrollments increased 40 (14%)
- Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences Division had the highest number of course enrollments overall, recording 4,615 down slightly -60 (-1%) from Fall 2006
- Business, Computer Science, and Mathematics Division; and Career and Technical Education Division both recorded a 10% decrease in course enrollments from Fall 2006 (-460 and -155 respectively)
