

**Mountain View College**  
**Fall 2008 Credit Student Enrollment Change Analysis**  
**October 6, 2008**  
**Executive Summary**

The Fall 2008 census headcount of 7,145 students sets a new record high enrollment for Mountain View College. This is 3.9% (270) more students than Fall 2007, and 1.5% (101) students higher than the previous record high enrollment that occurred in Fall 2006.

**Unduplicated Student Headcount Highlights**

**Demographics:** *(page 1 of "MVC Fall 2008 Enrollment Analysis Report")*

- Female students continue to outnumber male students 60% to 40%
- Hispanic and Asian students continue to increase in number and proportion while Black and White students continue to decrease.
- Hispanic students are now the majority ethnic group making up 51% of the MVC student body
- Average age is 26 years old with 64% (4,582) students are age 16-25 years
- Students in age groups 21-25 years and 46-50 years recorded notable increases over Fall 2007

**Classification:** *(page 2)*

- Three out of four MVC students (76%) are enrolled part-time
- Second year (sophomore) students increased 13% (306) up to 2,680
- First-Time-in-College (FTIC) students increased 4% (42) up to 1,097

**Student Declared Majors:** *(page 3)*

- Undecided majors make up 42% (2,977) of all students
- Followed by Liberal Arts and Sciences majors 34% (2,399)
- Followed next by Accounting, Business, and Management majors 7% (463)

**Recent High School Graduates Enrolled at MVC:** *(page 3)*

- Recent high school graduates (class of 2008) enrolled at MVC increased 29% (197) to 879
- The top five high schools in terms of recent graduates enrolled at MVC are Moises Molina, Duncanville, South Grand Prairie, Sunset, and Grand Prairie

**Financial Aid: (As of October 6, 2008)** *(pages 6-7)*

- Total students (not including dual-credit) receiving financial aid decreased 20% from 1,513 to 1,402 unduplicated students
- These 1,402 students have received 1,899 types of aid totaling \$2,074,746
- The largest decreases were in Federal Pell Grants and Student Loans; Texas Grants, and DCCCD Rising Star Scholarships
- MVC Students receiving tuition waivers for Dual-Credit or MVC Early College High School totaled 488

**Unduplicated Student Headcount Highlights (continued)**

**ZIP Code:** *(pages 8-9)*

- Total MVC service area residents enrolled at MVC increased 179 to 5,136 (72% of the student body)
  - 6% of these students reside in Cedar Hill, 45% reside in Dallas, 8% in Duncanville, and 14% in Grand Prairie
- MVC service area ZIP codes with the highest increases (20+) include: Cedar Hill 75104; Dallas 75208 and 75211; and Grand Prairie 75051 and 75052
- Students residing in Duncanville decreased for the fourth consecutive Fall semester
- Non MVC service area ZIP codes with the highest increases (10+) include: Addison; Grand Prairie 75050, Irving, Lancaster, Arlington, and Tarrant County-other

**Duplicated Student Course Enrollments Highlights**

As of census day Fall 2008, there were 17,354 duplicated student course enrollments. This is 4% (683) higher than in Fall 2007 at census day.

**Schedule:** *(page 4)*

- MWF and MW days make up 4,954 (29%), and TR days make up 4,650 (27%) of total student course enrollments
- Weekend enrollments increased 30% (152) over last fall to 665
- Weekday time-of-day enrollments: Morning – 7,392 (43% of total); Afternoon – 1,663 (10%); Evening – 4,199 (24%)
- Distance learning continues to increase, up 15% (221) over Fall 2007 to 1,725
- Self-paced continues to decrease, down 26% (-182) from Fall 2007 to 515
- Flex day (<16 weeks) enrollments increased 26% (113) over Fall 2007 to 545

**Instructional Division Highlights:** *(page 5)*

- Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences Division; and the Science, Allied Health, and Physical Education Division had the largest course enrollment increases compared to Fall 2007 with increases of 9% and 15% respectively
- Communications and Teacher Education Division course enrollments increased for the fourth consecutive Fall semester up 98 course enrollments to 4,566 (26% of the total)
- Career and Technical Education Division course enrollments decreased for the third consecutive Fall semester down 155 (-11%) course enrollments to 1,204 (7% of the total)
