

**Mountain View College**  
**Spring 2009 Credit Student Enrollment Change Analysis**  
**February 23, 2009**  
**Executive Summary**

The Spring 2009 census headcount of 7,370 students sets another record high enrollment for Mountain View College. This is 10% (670) more students than Spring 2008, and 3% (225) students higher than Fall 2008 the previous record high enrollment. This is also the first time that the Spring headcount surpassed Fall headcount in the same academic year.

***Comparisons are all relative to Spring 2008***

**Unduplicated Student Headcount Highlights**

**Demographics:**

- Males increased at a higher rate (+12.5%) than females (+8%). Females continue to outnumber males at a rate 59% to 41%
- All four major ethnic groups increased in number. The highest percentage change for any group was +45% (+122) for Asian, Pacific Islanders, followed by Hispanics (+13%), Whites (+9%), and Blacks (+2%)
- The highest percentage change in age groups was +20% (+38) for 51 years and over; followed by 16-20 years (+13%), and 31-40 years (+12%)

**Classification:**

- Three out of four MVC students (77%) are enrolled part-time
- First-Time-in-College (FTIC) students increased 14% (+61) up to 490. The largest number of Spring FTIC students on record

**Fall to Spring Retention:**

- 4,553 (62%) of Spring 2009 students returned from Fall 2008, compared to 56% of Spring 2008 and Spring 2007 students returning from the previous Fall terms
- Hispanics returned at a rate of 68% each Spring, while Asians, Blacks, and Whites returned at rates of 58% or less

**Student Declared Majors:**

- Undecided majors remain the largest group 40% (2,937) of all students, followed by Liberal Arts and Sciences majors 37% (2,695)
- With the exception of Aviation and Welding, all other major groups declined

### **Duplicated Student Course Enrollments Highlights**

As of census day Spring 2009, there were 17,143 duplicated student course enrollments. This is 7% (1,117) higher than in Spring 2008 at census day.

#### **Schedule:**

- MWF and MW days make up 4,349 (25%), and TR days make up 4,327 (25%) of total student course enrollments
- Weekend enrollments decreased 12% (-74) to 534
- Time-of-day: Morning – 42% of total; Afternoon – 14%; Evening –24%. Afternoon enrollments had the highest percentage increase at +17% (+344)
- Distance learning continues to increase, up 12% (+249) to 2,276
- Self-paced continues to decrease, down 10% (-70) to 627

#### **Instructional Division Highlights:**

- NOTE: For this report, CATE courses remain listed under the previous instructional division organization. CATE course enrollments increased at almost the same rate as overall course enrollment growth increasing 7% (+80) to 1,303. All departments grew except Computer Information Technology
- AHSS, BCSM, and CMTE divisions course enrollments grew at 10%, 8%, and 6% respectively
- SAHPE division course enrollment decreased 3% (-62). Nursing and Physical Education courses decreased, while Science courses increased slightly
- HDEV enrollment increased 37% from 242 to 332 total course enrollments

#### **Financial Aid: (As of February 16, 2009)**

- Total students (not including dual-credit) receiving financial aid increased 26% from 1,529 to 1,909 unduplicated students
- Pell Grants increased, other Federal Loans and Texas Grants decreased
- MVC Students receiving tuition waivers for Dual-Credit or MVC Early College High School totaled 722
- 228 MVC Enterprise Scholarships were awarded

#### **ZIP Code:**

- MVC service area ZIP codes with the highest increases include: Cedar Hill 75104; Dallas 75211; Duncanville (all ZIPs) and Grand Prairie 75052
- Non MVC service area ZIP codes with the highest increases include: Dallas and Grand Prairie north of I-30; Garland, and Irving
