

2008-2009 Mountain View College PRIORITIES

The "College Priorities" are developed each year by the Planning Budget and Assessment (PBA) Committee. These priorities consider current environmental factors and reflect the Mission and Goals of the "MVC 2008-2012 Strategic Plan." The "College Priorities" will be used in conjunction with the "MVC 2008-2012 Strategic Plan" to guide construction of the 2008-2009 Annual Unit Plans-Budgets and the College Budget.

2008-2009 College Priorities:

Mountain View College's primary focus for 2008-2009 will include the following six priorities. College resource allocation including supplemental expense requests, unit-level planning, return week themes, professional development activities, grant proposals, and institutional decision-making will be guided by these priorities. **(NOT IN PRIORITY ORDER)**

- Increased market penetration in under-represented service-area neighborhoods and populations (*MVC Goals 1, 3, 4*)
- Increased community focused workforce development initiatives such as weekend programs designed to upgrade individuals' career skills; and expanded partnerships with local business communities (*MVC Goals 1, 3, 4*)
- On-going faculty, professional support staff, and administrator professional development to enhance rigor, relevance and relationships across instructional, student service, and administrative service areas (*MVC Goals 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6*)
- Systematic and comprehensive on-going development of professional learning communities such as the Instructional Council and the College Council (*MVC Goals 2, 6*)
- Deliberate targeted additions and strengthening of all learning modalities including distance education and non-traditional pedagogical approaches (*MVC Goals 1, 2, 3*)
- Systematic integration of outcomes assessment and use of results to inform college-wide planning and decision-making, and to proactively ensure that the college satisfies external accountability requirements (*MVC Goals 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6*)
